Writing the Next Chapter Update

We continue to press forward in many areas - Hickey Architects is finishing the detailed drawings, currently totaling 83 pages, for bidding and construction, A Funk & Sons is updating cost estimates and work schedules, volunteers are working in the duplex and staff are sorting and organizing within the existing library, both efforts to prepare for construction to start later this year.

By the end of March we expect to hear the results of our Keystone Grant application. Then we will decide how much of the project to include in the first phase. Regardless of the grant outcome we have raised enough money to build the addition between the existing library and the neighboring duplex, so we are planning a ground breaking ceremony for the second half of June. Watch for the date of this event to put on your calendar.

Our successful fund raiser on February 15th called "Light up Your Library" had nearly 200 luminaries and raised community awareness about our project. Come support our next community fund raiser for the Library's annual operating budget, a Trivia Night contest on March 25th at the American Legion catered by Rotunda Restaurant. Please help us modernize and expand our library for the benefit of our communities.

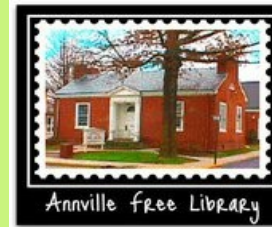

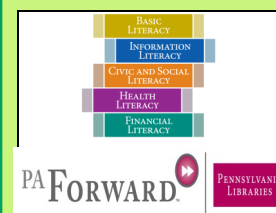

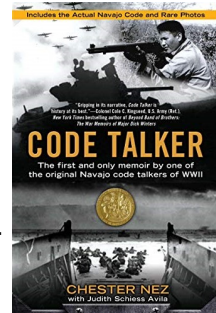

Code Talker: The First and Only Memoir by One of the Original Navajo Code Talkers of WWII by Chester Nez



His name wasn't Chester Nez. That was the English name he was assigned in kindergarten. And in boarding school at Fort Defiance, he was punished for speaking his native language, as the teachers sought to rid him of his culture and traditions. But discrimination didn't stop Chester from answering the call to defend his country after Pearl Harbor, for the Navajo have always been warriors, and his upbringing on a New Mexico reservation gave him the strength - both physical and mental - to excel as a marine.

During World War II, the Japanese had managed to crack every code the United States used. But when the Marines turned to its Navajo recruits to develop and implement a secret military language, they created the only unbroken code in modern warfare - and helped assure victory for the United States over Japan in the South Pacific.
